The Bluefish should increase in numbers and size as well. The Sea Bass should start increasing in numbers by early

October. The Stripers seemed to have established a pretty good local population. They can be caught in backwaters all summer long. The migratory run seems to be late the last few years. The offshore sport fishing looks for a chunk bite on the Tuna at the usual places like the 19 Fathom Lump. The Marlin fishing should remain strong thru September weather permitting.

The fall seems to be a reflective time for me. The hectic days of summer a recent memory. The beauty of fall foliage with its vibrant colors... even the fish sense the need to get together and leave before the harsh winds and cold water closes in on their daily life. I think we should take a hint from nature and enjoy this beautiful time of year.
