Classical Education

Will your child be the next Leonardo da Vinci, Galileo, Sir Isaac Newton, William Shakespeare, George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, or John Adams? Possible, if he or she is attending the new learning program at Calvary OP church in Wildwood. For centuries, the leaders that have shaped history have been classically educated. These great men lived up to their potential because it was unlocked in part by the classical methods of education. Many schools include classical content, and yet do not use classical methods of education. This ancient pedagogy of instruction recognizes three levels of learning and thinking together known as the Trivium. The grammar, dialectic, and rhetoric stages of development correspond to a child's intellectual growth.

In September of 2008, this learning center launched their program to serve the community by offering quality education. Christine Thomson has twenty-six years of experience and the academic proficiency necessary to facilitate an excellent learning environment and program of study, while Carol Hauser, her assistant, brings thirteen years, nine of which have been in a Classical Christian School. Jan McDonough, a Penn graduate, offers her area of expertise in the fine arts program.

The curriculum is designed to give the class a delightful first experience with a strong phonetic program called **Spell to Write and Read** where children spell their way into writing and reading. Living math books are used to teach basic math skills such as number recognition and counting. The students are able to recognize numbers as well as write them through the hundreds. They can skip count, use a calendar, work with money, and are exposed to clock work. Since a child's attention span is short, all lessons are given in short manageable segments. The first years are an ideal time for memorizing favorite poetry, catechism questions, and scripture verses from the Bible. These students have been exposed to classical composers, famous artists, Latin words and phrases, lots of geography and classical children's literature. They are reading Bob Books, and starting to sound out harder readers on their own. Lap books are developed to enhance learning a good piece of literature. In addition, they play the xylophone in music class and have been taught how to draw from the masters. Materials such as globes, floor maps, hands on science matter, games and lots of books are used to promote the children's interest. The Classical Christian Model of education is further characterized by a rich exposure to the history, art, music and culture of Western Civilization, including its languages (Latin and Greek). Integration is key in classical learning. And of course, no learning experience is complete without play, snacks, and song singing.

So whether or not your child is destined to become this century's answer to Thomas Jefferson or William Shakespeare, this learning experience at Calvary OP Church can start them off on their own path to greatness.
